# WELCOME TO THE 31ST OXFORD INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S FESTIVAL **THREADS OF LIBERATION**

The annual Oxford International Women's Festival returns to present a varied and exciting series of events across Oxford, from Saturday, February 29th to Saturday, March 14th, 2020.

Since the Festival began in 1989 it has always focused on Women's International Day, March 8th, the day when women throughout the world celebrate women's struggles for political, trade union and employment rights. It has also covered a multitude of topics ranging from the arts to the sciences, supporting women's creativity, and initiating and supporting campaigns on women's rights such as those concerned with homelessness.

The title for the 2020 Festival '*Threads for Liberation*' links to women's rights. It is inspired by the 50th anniversary of the first Women's Liberation Conference, held at Ruskin College, Oxford on February 29th, 1970. The celebration of this event will open the Festival. Some of the original conference participants will be present. This conference encouraged many women to question women's role in society and to campaign for women's equality and equality of opportunity. The Conference was committed to four demands: equal pay, improved education, twenty-four hour nurseries, free contraception and abortion on demand. This thread of liberation was a continuation of earlier struggles such as the abolition of slavery and campaigns for women's suffrage and for welfare rights. Since then the struggle for women's liberation has continued and changed to reflect growing concerns about women's role in society so that it now includes debates on sexuality, diversity and body image. This has all been influenced by the way in which ideas are communicated and how political and personal relationships continue to govern society in both positive and negative ways.

The 2020 Festival aims to debate and examine some of these 'threads of liberation' and how these influence women's lives locally, nationally and internationally through music, dance, film, discussion and debate.

As usual the Festival is organised by local women representing a wide range of backgrounds and experiences. The organisers would like to thank you all for contributing to the Festival.

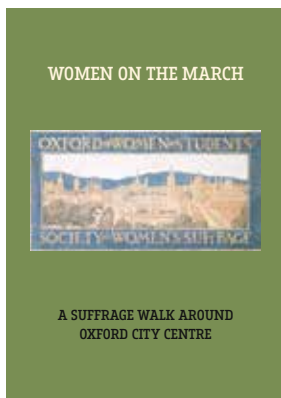
